We have been blessed to be the focus of the Holy Name/St. Anne's Society breakfast this year. Due to their hard work and the generous nature of the Navilleton parish the Faith Formation has received a donation of \$817. This money is stated to update the curriculum in grades 4-12. We have already started a new program this year in 9/10 and it is going very well. I believe the Pflaum

Weekly program is fine for the Pre-k through 3rd grade, but would like to update the older classes with a more in depth lesson of Catholicism, not just restating what is said in the Gospel each week. I am also hoping to purchase a more up date TV for the Parish Hall for them to be able to use updated resources that are free to upload rather

than purchase.

We have found a catechist to fill the opening we had in fourth grade. Theresa Law is returning to continue the class for us. She was the catechist in that class last year, so she is familiar with the curriculum and is up to date on background check as well as Safe and Sacred.

The 11/12 and 9/10 grades have completed their class participation Mass and Reconciliation with Ft. Pius. Almost all of the classes have now completed the Circle of Grace curriculum provided by the Archdiocese. We are preparing for Advent by making Advent wreaths in both buildings. The students will be starting each class during lent with group Advent prayers during the season.
