Holy Name Meeting Minutes – August 7, 2018

The Meeting opened with the Holy Name Pledge and Pledge of Allegiance at 7:05 PM following mass. Previous Month's Minutes were read by Ron Naville. Steve Price made a motion to approve the minutes and Steve Welp seconded the motion.

Old Business (June or Earlier Topics)

* Work Party: The work party went well and had a lot of good help. We got a lot done. One does not realize

how much of an impact volunteer work can add up. Thanks to all who help donate their time throughout the whole year, who do not get recognized, and who donate equipment/supplies.

o With the help of Dennis and Jackie Lattis and the 60 ft lift the Schickels were so generous to allow us to use, we were able to wash the whole church and rectory. This alone was a 2-day project.

o We also used the lift to trim dead branches out of the trees which was another 6-8 hours of use of their equipment.

o We also repaired the commode in the outside men's restroom, mix and poured concrete to help support the parish residence back steps where the ground had sunk away from, pulled weeds, trimmed bushes, and placed mulch around the landscape. Thanks to Keith for hauling away all the weeds and tree trimmings, which was a huge trailer load.

o Just the cost of a lift alone, we saved at least \$2,000.00 dollars. If we had to pay the labor of all the projects completed, we saved an additional estimated cost of \$2,200.00 dollars based on 15.00 per hour for 150 hours; and that's being very conservative. We saved an additional \$1,500.00 on mulch received from Earth First and Smith Creek. Total savings: \$5,700.00; but in reality, closer to \$8,000.00.

o This cost does not include the reason the Schickel's equipment was up here in the first place. Jeremy was making repairs to the steeple and the chimney on the church.

* With the work party as evidence, we would like to bring awareness to the power of volunteer work and the financial savings it can provide.

* Parish Fun Picnic: Scheduled for August 26, 2018 from 12:00 – 3:00. We will probably be setting up tables the Thursday before if the building is not being used by anyone else. Time to be determined later. If you can help, call or text Ron N. 502-645-9825

* Road side clean up: Scheduled for August 18, at 8:30AM, Church gets a 40% discount on property run off water bill.

* Holy Name breakfast fundraiser for the Holy Name is on September 23, 2018. We will discuss the menu at the September meeting.

* Ron would like to make the (Wednesday) of the 2nd week of July every year as a working party day. We used to prep for the picnic; but since we don't have a picnic, we still have plenty of things to do to help keep our church/grounds cleaned up/repared.

* Keith suggested moving the working party to June for trimming Shrubs and landscape. Keith also suggested to send out emails with the list of things to do during the month to keep up with the work.

* Jeff will schedule Masses in remembrance of Bob Naville
